

#### **DISTRICT WISE ACTIVITIES**



#### **East Garo Hills**

The World Bank Mission Team visited Mendal Songma and interacted with the community members and followed-up on the ongoing interventions under the Community Led Landscape Management Project (CLLMP).





The DPMU-EGH team inspected the Open Lime Channel (OLC) in Chima Dachit village in East Garo Hills on 23rd November. The OLC is a simple construction for treating mine affected water with limestone cobbles that helps increase the pH and alkalinity of the acidic water. On the following day, the team held a meeting at Mandalgre village regarding the GREEN (PES), Catalytic Fund and NRM activities.





Chief Minister, Shri Conrad K Sangma interacted with the beneficiaries of Meghalaya's flagship programs - FOCUS, PROGRESS, SHG, YESS Meghalaya, and GREEN Meghalaya at Umlyngka Football Ground, Mylliem Block, East Khasi Hills district.

The Chief Minister also distributed dummy cheques for Payment for Ecosystem Services (PES) to 104 communities and 242 individual beneficiaries from 6 Districts of Meghalaya.

#### **DISTRICT WISE ACTIVITIES**

The VCF SM, in co-ordination with the EE Social Management visited Nonglum Jirang Village under Jirang C&RD Block, and helped the VCF in arranging, as well as translating the book of minutes from Khasi to English. Additionally, the EE SM briefed the new VCF on the CLLMP project and her involvement in its execution.









## West Khasi Hills

Three day Intensive Training was conducted for the last batch of VCFs under Scale Program in West Khasi Hills District from 1st to 3rd December 2022, where 110 VCFs from 40 villages attended the training.



# West Garo Hills

The Knowledge Management team WGH visited Sasatgre village on 26th November, to inspect and document the second tranche activities of Shri Dharmen G Momin under the Grassroot Innovation fund.

Mr. Momin has been successfully producing Karitchi, which is a substitute for Sodium bicarbonate available in the market.





#### **DISTRICT WISE ACTIVITIES**



The World Bank Mission
Team along with the external expert and DMPU, WGH visited Arbella Chidekgre under Rongram Block to inspect the check dam which was constructed under the Meghalaya Community Led Landscape Management Project funded by World Bank.







The DMPU-SWGH conducted site inspection at Domisil Chiring, Anangpara and Bainapara Koch for the construction of check dam, water tank and spring chamber respectively. The Village Natural Resources Management Committee and the village's requirements guided the development of the project proposal for the aforementioned constructions. The team also had a meeting with the VCFs to discuss defining the boundaries of the NRM villages.

#### STORY OF THE WEEK

#### **Apiculture in Mudhive Model**

Meghalaya has enormous potential in the apiculture industry because the honey produced here is regarded as one of the best in the nation. The practice of apiculture gives beekeepers a means of subsistence while eventually protecting bees and preventing their extinction.



Smt. Lamuni N Sangma from Chichotcheng village in the Bajengdoba C&RD block made the decision to pursue apiculture as a career after realising the value of bees for pollination and their potential for livelihood. She created a novel approach to beekeeping by using a clay bee hive as an alternative to a wooden hive.

Clay is readily available and also offers a good and pleasant environment for the bee

Sangma stated, "Clay is readily available and also offers a good and pleasant environment for the bee." The mud hive type keeps the beehive at an appropriate temperature for the bees as it provides warmth in the winter and maintains a cool environment in the summer, she added. She discovered that the mud hive produces more honey than the wooden hive does in comparison. Additionally, it is more effective in safeguarding honey bees from extinction.



Through MBMA, she was given a grant of Rs 350,000 as innovation fund to expand her apiculture business.

Smt. Lamuni is now producing honey on a greater scale and receiving a competitive market price for the product thanks to this innovation fund.

While absconding is a big issue with wooden hives, which has an impact on the yield of honey, mud hives boost bee population and have a low absconding rate. Clay, bamboo, and wood are the basic building elements needed to create the mud hive model, and they are all readily available, environmentally acceptable, and biodegradable.



members from within the district.






